**Nursing Roles Graphic Organizer**

**Description:**

Advanced registered nurses work in highly collaborative environments and must collaborate with interdisciplinary teams in order to provide excellent patient care.

Besides knowing the role and scope of one's own practice, it is essential to understand the role and scope of other nurse specialties to ensure effective collaboration among nurses, the organization, and other professionals with whom advanced registered nurses regularly interact.

Use the "Nursing Roles Graphic Organizer Template" to differentiate how advanced registered nurse roles relate to and collaborate with different areas of nursing practice.

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<b>Ethics</b>	Some of the ethics, values and principles that a clinical nurse specialist must have include: informed consent, competence, autonomy, and beneficence.	Just like clinical nurse specialists, geriatric nurses must also observe nursing values, ethics, and principles that govern the nursing practice. Some of the nursing ethics that geriatric nurses must observe include beneficence, nonmaleficence, privacy, autonomy, justice, and fidelity (Rasoal et al., 2017).	All nurses have the same training to provide patient care. However, nursing roles differ depending on one's area of specialty. In this regard, geriatric clinical nurses are skilled nurses specializing in the treatment of the elderly people. These nurses have specialized education to understand and deal with complex mental and physical problems of older people. Conversely, clinical nurse specialists offer direct patient care through patient examination, diagnosis, and treatment. Other roles performed by clinical nurse specialists include: serving as expert consultants for
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			<p>other nurse staffs (Mohr, &amp; Coke, 2017). The major difference between geriatric nursing and clinical nurse specialist is that the latter often work in administrative and management positions while the former perform more of direct patient care roles.</p>
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<b>Education</b>	<p>To begin with, clinical nurse specialist-CNS must successfully complete a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) after which they must obtain an RN-Registered Nurse License to be allowed to operate as a nurse. To become a CNS, the nurse must enroll into and successfully complete a</p>	<p>To become a geriatric nurse, a person must first obtain a Bachelor of Science-BSN degree. After successfully completing the BSN, the person must register as a licensed nurse by enrolling and passing the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) examination. The last step to becoming a geriatric nurse is to enroll and</p>	<p>Both CNSs and geriatric nurses study for the same Bachelors of science in nursing. However, at master's level, geriatric nurses specialize in courses that deal with the elderly.</p>

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<b>Public Health</b>	<p>CNS plays an active role in improving access to wellness as well as preventative care.
